The regular meeting of the Township Committee of the Township of Cranbury was held at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Hall Meeting Room. Answering present to the roll call were Township Committee members: David Cook, Glenn Johnson, Daniel Mulligan, Jay Taylor and Mayor Susan Goetz. Also present were Denise Marabello, Township Administrator/Director of Finance; and Kathleen Cunningham, Municipal Clerk/Assistant Administrator. Mayor Goetz led in the salute to the flag, and Ms. Cunningham gave the following Open Public Meetings Act statement:

Re-Organization Meeting Minutes of January 2, 2014

On motion by Mr. Mulligan, seconded by Mr. Taylor and unanimously carried, the Re-Organization Meeting Minutes of January 2, 2014 were adopted.

#### Reports and Communications

--Mayor

Mayor Goetz thanked the public for the opportunity to serve as Mayor. She also thanked those who came out in such bad weather to attend the Re-organization Meeting on January 2<sup>nd</sup>. Mayor Goetz reported there will be a budget meeting on Saturday, January 18<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. until approximately 4:00 p.m. She stated the Committee is hoping to get through the budget process in one (1) day; however, she noted it will be a tough budget year.

Mayor Goetz reported the Planning Board approved applications submitted by Prologis and Sudler.

Mayor Goetz appointed Phyllis Smith to the Municipal Alliance Committee to fill the vacancy of Melanie Johnson, which expires December 31, 2016. Mayor Goetz also appointed Linda Scott to the Middlesex County Solid Waste Advisory Council, which is a one-year term expiring on December 31, 2014.

Mayor Goetz announced there was a typo on the appointments at the last meeting. She stated she was to appoint a Class 1 Planning Board Member, and named herself.

### -- Township Committee

Mr. Cook expanded on Mayor Goetz's comments concerning the approved applications made by the Planning Board. He stated Veridian was also recently approved and explained there was confusion about the sudden interest in expanding current and future warehouse space. Mr. Cook reported the Panama Canal finishes its widening in 2015 and the scale of the ships will be three (3) times the size of the ships currently passing through the

Township Committee (Continued) (Mr. Cook cont'd.)

Canal. The thought is more storage space will be needed to accommodate the larger shipments coming in at one time.

Mr. Cook reported it is "Day 69" of the 300-day Brainerd Lake Bridge/Dam Project, and the Project is on schedule. He reported the sheathing has been installed around the spillway, expanding the spillway from 40 feet to 100 feet in width.

Mr. Mulligan reported the Cranbury-Plainsboro Little League (CPLL) is planning on making improvements to the C-1 baseball field. Mr. Mulligan reported he and Ms. Marabello, Township Administrator, will meet with CPLL, Mr. Tom Weidner from the Parks Commission, and Ms. Beth Veghte from Recreation to discuss the improvements, which include the dugout and drainage issues. Mr. Mulligan stated he will report back to the Committee after the meeting.

Mr. Mulligan provided information about a property tax card program, which encourages residents to shop locally and receive rebates on their property taxes. Mr. Mulligan stated the program is intriguing because residents want their property taxes lowered, and businesses in the Township would benefit from the additional business. He stated more information is needed and stated he and Ms. Marabello will meet with the company providing the service. If the idea seems beneficial, a presentation will be made to the Township Committee for further discussion.

Ms. Cunningham stated Robbinsville has had the program for about eight (8) months, and stated it has been very successful. Mr. Cook inquired if the resident or business benefitted from the tax rebate, and Mr. Mulligan stated the homeowner would benefit from the tax rebate and the businesses would see additional customers. Mr. Mulligan stated Manalapan and Voorhees also participate in the program.

Mr. Mulligan addressed the Plainsboro Road flooding issue. Mr. Toby Bonagura, Plainsboro Road, contacted Mr. Mulligan concerning the drainage and resulting ice on his property. Mr. Mulligan inquired if the next step to correct this issue would be a discussion at a Work Session. Ms. Marabello stated the Township Engineer, Bill Tanner, has been surveying the project and the Township will be going out to bid on the project in the next couple of months. Mr. Cook stated the funding has already been set aside for the project. Ms. Marabello stated Mr. Tanner will be reaching out to the homeowners impacted by the project. Mr. Cook stated he and Mr. Tanner have already reached out to the residents since this has been an on-going issue.

Mr. Johnson reported he attended a DRC meeting and reported new warehouse projects will be coming down the pipeline. He stated the Township has seen retrofitting of warehouses; however there has been no new groundbreaking.

Mr. Taylor stated \$7,000 in permit fees was received last month and stated the Construction Trust will dry up without additional fees. Ms. Marabello stated there is about two (2) years of Construction Trust left at the current rate. If additional building occurs in the Township, the Trust will be in better shape.

Mayor Goetz asked the Township Committee if there were any questions or comments on the Consent Agenda, or if any Resolutions should be addressed separately. Mr. Taylor inquired if he should abstain from voting on Resolution # R 01-14-021 concerning the dredging since it was within 200 feet of the Fire House, of which he is a member. Mayor Goetz explained the need to dredge the Lake has been discussed for many years. She stated one of the issues was

understanding what the quality of the dredging material is since that will be the major cost factor if the material is contaminated. The Township has a proposal from Sadat Associates that agreed to perform an analysis for \$2,900. Three (3) samples will be collected and run for full sweep of chemical parameters to determine if the sediment is seriously contaminated or not. The Township would then meet with the DEP to determine subsequent steps to move forward with the dredging. Mayor Goetz explained the thought is there will be less contamination than when it was last dredged many years ago because of the stricter controls on PCB and leaded gas. However, she stated there is runoff from the farms so there may be some contamination. She stated the three (3) samples will be taken from Route 130, the middle of the Lake and one at the Dam. Mayor Goetz stated she will be recusing herself because she had previously worked for Sadat Associates. Mr. Taylor stated he did not work for the company; however, he is a member of the Fire Department. He was advised if residents within 200 feet were noticed (which would include the Fire Department) and there resulted in a benefit to the properties because of the dredging, it could be a conflict. Mr. Johnson suggested a separate vote be taken on this Resolution. Mr. Cook reported he looked up the history on the past dredging, and stated the dredging alone cost \$165,000. Mayor Goetz stated that project was done before there was a Department of Environmental Protection. She stated when the dredging was previously done. the sediment was placed in Village Park. Mr. Mulligan stated the Township has an obligation to take care of the Lake, which is one of the most recognizable assets of the community. Mayor Goetz stated Resolution # R 01-14-021, Professional Services Agreement for Dredging Feasibility Analysis for Brainerd Lake, would be voted on separately from the Consent Agenda. Mayor Goetz asked the Township Committee if there were any questions on the other Resolutions. # Reports from Township Staff and Professionals

#### -- Administrator's Report

Ms. Marabello reported the Public Works Department is picking up leaves and will continue to do so the next two (2) weeks, weather permitting. She stated at that point they should be done, providing residents do not put out more leaves. The leaf machine broke, and Public Works has borrowed East Windsor's leaf machine to complete the leaf pickup. Mayor Goetz clarified residents are not to put more leaves to the curb and stated this is just to pick up what was previously put out.

Ms. Marabello stated the Township will be leasing parking spaces from the Witt's, and work will commence on that in March, weather permitting also. The Township will be meeting with the Witt's to discuss the signage to be placed on the property. She stated the parking spaces should be available in the spring.

Mr. Taylor inquired about the broken leaf machine. Ms. Marabello stated the truck broke down and was promptly repaired by George's Garage. However, it broke down again during the snow storm, and has been repaired again. She stated the truck is older and is breaking down more frequently.

Mr. Taylor reported he is having issues with the webmail and he is working with City Connections to address the issue. Ms. Cunningham stated she was having similar problems. Mr. Taylor stated he will be meeting with Morris Enyeart.

Mr. Mike Kervan, Chief of the Cranbury Volunteer Fire Department, gave report for December 2013, as follows: 27 calls with volunteers contributing 452 hours of service. For 2013, there were 340 calls, 24 members qualified for LOSAP, and members volunteered 4,222.5 hours of service. He reported the truck committee made a trip to KME for the pre-construction conference on special services apparatus truck. He reported aside from a small issue with the air conditioner in the truck, the trip was successful.

Mr. Kervan reported that due to the construction at the Dam, there have been issues with parking in the Fire Department parking lot. Chief Kervan reported several issues of trucks and tractor trailers parking in the lot, which blocked the Fire House doors. Mr. Cook asked Chief Kervan to keep him posted of these issues so he can follow up with the contractor and the engineer. Chief Kervan stated the bays and entrances to the Fire House must be kept open because emergencies can arise at any time. Mr. Cook stated the trucks are parked behind the Fire House at night, and Chief Kervan stated there is no problem parking behind the Fire House.

### Reports from Township Boards and Commissions

Mr. Andrew Johnson, Environmental Commission (EC) member discussed with the Township Committee the EC's desire to apply for a "Sustainable New Jersey Grant" and "Anti-idling Community Education." Mr. Johnson reported the EC would like to apply to the State of New Jersey for a \$20,000 grant to update the environmental resource inventory and to continue the Sustainable New Jersey Program. He explained the funding comes from PSE&G Sustainable New Jersey Program and stated the application is due on January 26, 2013 with a response due back in mid-March. Mr. Johnson stated the grant will allow the EC to index the EC inventory and reported the last time this was done was in 2006. He stated many more of the Township's attributes will be highlighted. He stated the EC will partner with the Stony-Brook Millstone Association, which is encouraged by the Program. Mr. Johnson stated the EC needs a Resolution from the Township supporting the Grant and a signed Grantee's Certification Declaration, which states the Township will spend the grant funds in accordance with the Grant application.

Mayor Goetz inquired if these funds would be sufficient to cover their needs. Mr. Johnson stated the funds will cover the consultant's fees and stated some additional fees may be needed from the Township to cover administrative and IT costs. Ms. Marabello stated three (3) quotes are not needed for the grant application; however, they will be needed before work commences. Mr. Mulligan asked if this was a non-matching grant, and Mr. Johnson confirmed it is.

Mayor Goetz asked about the "Anti-idling Community Education" part of the Work Session. Ms. Barbara Rogers, Chairperson of the EC, stated they were going to submit for a \$2,000 "Anti-Idling Grant"; however, she stated only one grant would be awarded so this will be put on hold. Ms. Rogers stated the Inventory will be an important document. It will be more of a "living document" than the current document because it will be digitized and when new data becomes available, the record can be updated. The Township Committee thanked Mr. Johnson and Ms. Rogers.
