Mr. Johnson reported he attended a Cranbury Business and Professional Association Meeting. He reported the Association discussed their upcoming calendar events, including a "Touch-a-Truck" on July 12th from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 or 2:00 p.m. Public Works will provide several trucks for the event. Mr. Johnson stated the Association had asked if there was some space available in the barn they could use for storage; however, there is no space available. Mr. Johnson reported he also met with representatives of JET USA on Dey Road. He stated the Hindu-education organization talked about the work they do and they also discussed with Mr. Johnson the ways they could become more active in Cranbury.

Mr. Cook reported there was a delay on the veneering of the Brainerd Lake Bridge and Dam Project because of the weather; however, that work should continue quickly. He reported there was a change order for additional resurfacing near the Bridge so the work looks uniform. After the spillway work is complete, the cantilever work will begin.

Mr. Mulligan reported the C1 Baseball Field work is complete, and Public Works will now be putting dirt down on the field. He reported the Environmental Commission met on the Rain Garden. a.) <u>Discussion of Proposed Ordinance Amending Chapter 150-36 Outdoor Storage in Commercial</u>
Districts

Mr. Johnson presented to the Township Committee the proposed Ordinance amending the Township's Code in reference to Outdoor Storage in Commercial Districts. Mr. Johnson explained in the last six (6) months, the Planning and Zoning Boards have had three (3) applicants who wanted to move into Cranbury and needed the ability to store goods outdoors. Mr. Johnson stated all three (3) cases were located in a zone where outdoor storage is not allowed. He stated he is not sure why the Ordinance as written and previously amended excludes outdoor storage in some commercial zones. He explained this is presenting a problem because it is not a "clean" way to do zoning by continuing to make exceptions and do variances. Mr. Johnson rewrote Section B to include all of the commercial districts. He stated it would be better for the Ordinance to state what is permitted instead of prohibited for outdoor storage.

Mr. Cook clarified the new wording will be more accommodating, while the current wording is less relevant. Mr. Mulligan stated the current wording has been burdensome for some businesses. He inquired if there are other zoning limitations that prevent vehicles from being parked on commercial properties because there are a number of properties that are underutilized. There was discussion about the types of vehicles allowed to park on commercial properties, and Mr. Cook suggested looking at various scenarios since additional language in the Ordinance may be necessary. Mr. Mulligan stated there are businesses in Town that need parking and properties that are underutilized; it could be a win for the businesses and the Township to accommodate that sort of scenario. There was discussion about the location of commercial districts. Mr. Mulligan stated the commercial areas would include the Route 130 corridor and east of Route 130. Mr. Taylor stated excluding the Village Commercial and Village area makes sense because it is also residential. While South Main Street and Old Trenton is mixed commercial, there is a delicate balance on the permitted use. Mr. Mulligan stated if this area is zoned commercial, it should be included. Mr. Cook stated loosening up the restrictions on Route 130 is definitely needed and a good place to start. Mr. Mulligan stated he agrees with removing "Village Commercial" from the new wording. Mr. Taylor requested wording be added to exclude storage of materials for building projects. Mr. Johnson will work with the Township Attorney on the final wording to amend the Ordinance.

Mr. Art Hasselbach, Route 130, and a member of the Planning Board, stated the wording needs to be amended. There was discussion about the types of storage materials, and Mr. Hasselbach stated there has to be some differentiation with vehicles. Outside storage of products is separate from storage of licensed vehicles. He stated the amended wording will make it easier for upcoming applications.

Mr. Hasselbach explained Cranbury does not want to turn away business because other municipalities will be glad to have them, including Robbinsville, which is getting the ratables of many new businesses. There was additional discussion about junk cars, impound lots and farm equipment. Mr. Hasselbach stated the Township has to look at the whole picture; the Ordinance wording must protect the Township and also attract businesses for ratables.

Reports from Township Boards and Commissions

There were no reports from Township Boards and Commissions.

Reports from Township Staff and Professionals

-- Administrator's Report

Ms. Marabello reported the window of the main office of Town Hall has been replaced. She reported the hardware on the doors will be changed this week before the security system is installed next week.

Ms. Marabello reported the Township Attorney sent notification that the condemnation ruling has been appealed and it will be going to court.

Mr. Taylor inquired if bids are ready to go out for the painting. Ms. Marabello stated once the security system is completed, the painting of Town Hall will be the next project.

--Assistant Administrator's Report

Ms. Cunningham reported that per the FCC, effective July 23, 2014, the Cranbury "Access" Channel will no longer be Channel 3. The new channel will be Channel 26. Ms. Cunningham stated Ms. Larson will post the notice on the existing Channel 3. The information will also be posted on the Township's website and at Teddy's Restaurant. It was also suggested that the information be posted at Cranbury Pizza and Gill and Bert's.

Public Comment

Mr. Richard Kallan, Wynnewood Drive, stated the approach into Cranbury from Route 130 South is disgraceful, with an empty house and a closed business. He stated the Township has a Property Maintenance Ordinance and asked if complaints have been filed. Ms. Marabello stated several complaints have been received. Mr. Kallan stated he takes issue with the Township refusing to take any action unless a private citizen files a complaint. He stated that is outrageous, and stated the Ordinance does not require that. He stated if the Township is not willing to enforce the Ordinance it insisted be passed, then the Ordinance should be null and void. Mr. Mulligan stated a complaint must be filed because there was concern the Ordinance would be misused. There was additional discussion about the Property Maintenance Ordinance, and Mr. Mulligan stated it was written with minimal requirements (grass not taller than 12 inches, windows and doors covered). Mr. Kallan stated private citizens should not have to file the complaint and that action should be taken even if employees or Committee members see an issue. Mr. Mulligan stated the policy put in place per the Township Attorney requires a citizen file a complaint. He stated that wording does not have to be in the Ordinance.

Mr. Taylor clarified complaints can be made to the police and 9-1-1 without providing a name. Mr. Taylor stated he has been receiving complaints about the tall grass at the Swim Club. Ms. Marabello stated she spoke to the Health Officer when the grass was shorter. Ms. Marabello suggested the realtor also be called. There was additional discussion about various properties around the Township that also need attention. Mr. Mulligan stated if there is a problem, then a resident should file a complaint.

Public Comment

Ms. Bonnie Larson, Cranbury Neck Road, asked who gets the Property Maintenance complaint. Ms. Marabello stated Ms. Linda Scott accepts the complaints and forwards them to Mr. Jerry Thorne, Public Works Manager. Complaints can be written on paper or e-mailed to Ms. Scott. There being no further comments, the Mayor closed the public portion of the meeting.

Mayor's Notes Mayor Susan Goetz was absent.
