WHEREAS, the Township also currently owns property that is designated as Lot 20.03 in Block 7.01 on the Tax Map ("Lot 20.03") and is in the process of constructing its new Police Building thereon; and

WHEREAS, the Township also currently owns a 50 foot wide right-of-way referred to as "50' Access ROW" on a plan entitled "Plan of Survey and Major Subdivision – Block 7, Lot 20.01, Township of Cranbury, Middlesex County, New Jersey," prepared by Hatch Mott MacDonald and revised to January 15, 2003 ("Police Drive Extension"), and that will be used for purposes of extending Police Drive to Liberty Way; and

WHEREAS, there is a $\pm 1,452$ square foot parcel in between Lots 13 and 20.03 that extends the length of Lot 20.03 and is described in the attached Schedule "B" ("1,452 square foot parcel"); and

WHEREAS, the 1,452 square foot parcel is neither a part of Lot 13 nor 20.03 but is contiguous to both parcels; and

Reports from Township staff and professionals

Mr. Witt, Temporary Acting Administrator, updated the Township Committee on the Conagra issue. Mr. Witt indicated the Township had responded to a letter from the M.C.U.A. that Conagra had sent to the Director of the M.C.U.A. regarding allowing them to increase their sewer flow. Mr. Witt had sent the Director a letter, making him aware of the Township's situation with Conagra concerning the odors. The Director will be sending Mr. Witt a letter, which will state prior to making any changes in their sewer plan, Conagra will need a letter from Cranbury Township. Mr. Witt also had spoken with Andrew Kolb, Vice President of Prologis, to discuss sewer flow numbers and had a meeting scheduled with Mr. Kolb and the Township Engineer next week. Mr. Panconi indicated the Township had requested a meeting with the Middlesex County Board of Health, who had made a few changes and had not followed up with the Township. Mr. Stout raised a question if Conagra had filed a permit with the Township to install the fans, which were referenced in an earlier letter from the County. Mr. Witt indicated they had performed the work, and to the best of his knowledge they had not taken out a permit. This issue would also be brought up at the meeting.

Ms. Marcelli, Township Engineer, reported, as directed at the last meeting by the Township Committee, the remediation on the Wright South property had gone out to bid as of the previous Friday. Also, on Friday, Ms. Marcelli had received a letter from the D.E.P., approving the remedial action work permit and the remedial investigation report. It is anticipated the contract will be awarded on June 27, 2005 and a notice to proceed will be issued during that week. The project will take 60 days.

Reports from Township Boards and Commissions There were no reports.

Work Session

a. Township Administrator Search Process

The Township Committee discussed the search process for a Township Administrator. Mr. Panconi indicated the Personnel subcommittee would need an advertisement to go forward. Mr. Stannard asked the Township Committee consider the same process as had been followed in recruiting the Township Attorney; advertising in a couple of publications, putting the resumes in a binder for the members of the Township Committee and include a score sheet for the members to check off if they were interested. Mr. Stannard raised his concern with the Township Committee choosing the correct Administrator, and recommended not rushing the process. Mayor Beauregard commended Mr. Thomas Witt on his performance and professionalism over the past few weeks. Mayor Beauregard indicated the Personnel subcommittee had felt the services of a recruitment agency would not be needed, as the Township felt very comfortable with moving ahead with the search on their own. Mayor Beauregard also indicated if everyone felt comfortable with using the same process as the search for the Township Attorney, the Township

should move forward. Mr. Panconi indicated the Personnel subcommittee would be meeting on Wednesday, June 16, 2005 to discuss advertising the position and advertising deadlines. Mr. Panconi also indicated the Personnel subcommittee would come up with a draft for the job description and then e-mail it to the Township Committee members for review.

Public Comment

The Mayor opened the meeting to public questions and comments on those items not on the agenda. Mr. Richard Kallan, Wynnewood Drive, asked a question about Ordinance # 06-05-16, reappropriating funds, namely, what the original purpose of those funds had been. Mr. Witt responded the ordinances listed on the new ordinance gave the amount of those funds. The funds had been left over. Mr. Kallan also asked why the Township had to request Middlesex County to do a revaluation. Mayor Beauregard responded every County works differently. Some counties order municipalities to do a revaluation. However, Middlesex County requests a municipality formally request the County to perform the revaluation. Mr. John Ritter, Plainsboro Road, asked if the Township had a sense of the implications on the senior citizens in reference to the revaluation. In particular, if any of the seniors may have to move due to large increases in their taxes. Mayor Beauregard responded there was no way to know how much of an increase individuals would encounter and hopefully those increases would not be very large. Mayor Beauregard indicated she had been told if an individual had a home worth \$200,000 and when the revaluation took place it became \$400,000 the individual's home owner's taxes would not be doubled. Mayor Beauregard also indicated there was a brochure available which outlined various tax relief for seniors and others. Mr. Panconi indicated there would be a lot of communication with the residents, to keep them apprised during the revaluation process. Mr. Phil Moody, Cranbury Station Road, spoke concerning the residents' request on Halsey Reed Road to tie in to the water and sewer system. Mr. Witt responded he had been working on this issue and had been in touch with The American Water Company, as well as Monroe Township. Mr. Witt indicated he would be sending a letter to The American Water Company, confirming that the residents would be taken out of the franchise with them and putting them into the franchise with the Monroe Township Municipal Utilities Authority so those residents may tie into the water service in Monroe Township. Mr. Witt indicated in speaking with the Monroe Township Municipal Utilities Authority, they had indicated it would be approximately 18 months before residents would have the water main lines in front of their homes, allowing them to have the capability to hook up to them. Mr. Witt indicated earlier in the afternoon he had spoken with the Township Engineer, Cathleen Marcelli who indicated she would be moving forward to making an amendment to the Township's 208 Sewer

Plan, to take the residents out of the Township's plan and add the residents to Monroe Township's 208 Sewer Plan. A letter will be sent and Mr. Witt indicated he would make the residents a part of the process and hold meetings with the residents. Ms. Linda Scott, North Main Street resident and Township Employee, thanked the Township Committee for all of their energy and time they invest in coming to Township Committee Meetings, as well as all of the work they do behind closed doors that the public is not aware and also for allowing the ½ hour sick time increment amendment to the Employee Manual. Ms. Scott also made a suggestion to the Township Committee that they consider hiring a part-time Administrator. There being no further comments, the Mayor closed the public part of the meeting.
