CRANBURY TOWNSHIP RESOLUTION # R 10-20-123

TERMINATING CONTRACT BETWEEN TOWNSHIP OF CRANBURY AND TRICON ENTERPRISES, INC. FOR BRAINERD LAKE DREDGING PROJECT

WHEREAS, the Township of Cranbury solicited bids for the Brainerd Lake Dredging Project (the "Project"); and,

WHEREAS, by way of Resolution #R07-20-089 dated July 13, 2020, the Township awarded a Contract to Tricon Enterprises, Inc. as the lowest responsible bidder for the Project; and

WHEREAS, among other things, the Contract Documents required that the Contractor submit, for the review and approval of the Township's Project Engineer, a dewatering system design prepared by a New Jersey-licensed Professional Engineer experienced in design of construction dewatering systems, with drawings, calculations, and written descriptions of the proposed equipment, materials and procedures, at least 2 weeks prior to starting work (a "Dewatering Plan"); and

WHEREAS, the Contract Documents required that Tricon secure a water lowering permit from the New Jersey Division of Fish and Wildlife; and

WHEREAS, that permit requires that the water level be fully drawn down by November 1, and imposes restrictions on the rate of water release; and

WHEREAS, on September 21, 2020 Tricon submitted a proposed Dewatering Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Township's Project Engineer, Mr. Tom Decker, sent Tricon a Dewatering Plan Review Memorandum dated September 22, 2020, addressing certain substantive and procedural aspects of the Dewatering Plan that were not in compliance with the requirements of the Contract Documents; and

WHEREAS, the Contract Documents provide that

"Should the Contractor fail to abide by any provisions of this Contract, the Engineer will forward, by certified mail, to the Contractor, at the address given in the Contract, a Notice of Warning stating the reason of default with course of action to be followed. In the event the Contractor fails to comply with said Notice of Warning within five (5) days from receipt thereof, the Owner shall have the right to terminate the Contract without further notice"; and

WHEREAS, the Township Attorney's Office sent a Notice of Warning to Tricon on September 25, 2020 demanding that Tricon submit an acceptable dewatering plan and identify a subcontractor able to do the work within five (5) days; and

WHEREAS, a Project meeting was held seven (7) days later, on October 2, 2020, during which meeting Tricon stated that a Dewatering Plan would be submitted to the Project Engineer by Friday, October 9, 2020; and

WHEREAS, Tricon failed to submit a Dewatering Plan to the Project Engineer on or before Friday, October 9, 2020, and are therefore in default of the Contract; and

WHEREAS, based on Tricon's failure to submit a Dewatering Plan as required by the Contract Documents, the Township issued a Stop Work Notice and Notice of Intent to Terminate the Contract with Tricon on October 13, 2020; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Contract Documents, the Stop Work Notice and Notice of Intent to Terminate the Contract was accompanied by a written certification stating the professional opinion of the Project Engineer that "Tricon ha[d] not fulfilled its obligations, as specified in the Contract Documents, with regards to the rate of progress of the Work"; and

WHEREAS, it is apparent that the scope of services required under the contract, will not be satisfactorily performed by the contractor prior to the expiration of the lake lowering season, despite numerous assertions by Tricon to the contrary; and

WHEREAS, the Township, through the Project Engineer and Counsel have exchanged multiple correspondences and held numerous meetings with representatives of Tricon, pointing out the deficiencies and asking Tricon to comply with its contractual obligations, in an effort to ensure that the services required by the municipality are satisfactorily performed, and that residents in the community are securing the benefit of the contract; and

WHEREAS, Tricon continually failed to meet its responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, the Township Attorney's Notice of Warning letter of September 25, 2020 is incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Township Attorney's Stop Work Notice and Notice of Intent to Terminate of October 13, 2020 are incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the Township's concerns that Brainerd Lake would not be lowered by November 1, 2020, remain unresolved, unaddressed, and unsatisfied because no Dewatering Plan was submitted within the time period required by the Contract Documents, as communicated by the Project Engineer and Township Attorney; and

WHEREAS, Tricon has therefore materially breached its obligations to and the provisions of its Contract with the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Township Committee seeks to terminate the Contract with Tricon in accordance with the Contract Documents and N.J.S.A. 40A:11-50;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CRANBURY, COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, STATE OF NEW JERSEY AS FOLLOWS:

- 2. The Contract is hereby terminated.
- 3. The Township Attorney is authorized to negotiate and execute any and all instruments in connection with the default and termination of the Contract, including alternative dispute resolution practices in accordance with N.J.S.A. 40A:11-50.
