- Lisa Kneirnim Mrs. Kneirnim voiced her displeasure with the handling of the school survey and the decision to not allow changes once submitted. Mayor Ferrante advised her that they understand her concern and though her public comment was noted, the township committee is not responsible for the school decisions and her concerns should be sent to the Board of Education in order to be addressed properly.
- Denise McQueeney Ms. McQueeney asked if the Cranbury Post Office could be made larger. Mayor Ferrante explained that there are no plans to make the post office larger as they currently serve as a satellite for Hightstown.

Hearing no other public comment, Mayor Ferrante closed the meeting to public comment.
