The Township Committee Meeting of the Township of Cranbury was held at 7:00 p.m. in the Town Hall Meeting Room. Answering present to the roll call were Township Committee members: Susan Goetz, Glenn Johnson, Dan Mulligan, and Mayor Dave Cook. Mr. Jay Taylor was absent. Also present were Denise Marabello, Township Administrator/Director of Finance; and Kathleen R. Cunningham, Municipal Clerk/Assistant Administrator. Mayor Cook led in the salute to the flag, and Ms. Cunningham gave the following Open Public Meetings Act statement:

On motion by Mr. Johnson, seconded by Mr. Mulligan and unanimously carried, the Township Committee Minutes of April 24, 2017 were adopted.

Reports and Communications

- --Mayor Cook reported the County finished the paving on North Main Street and Cranbury Neck Road. He reported the road condition issues on Brickyard Road will be addressed once the construction of the warehouse is complete. He stated in the meantime, signage will be added to alert drivers to the conditions of the roadway. Mayor Cook reported a letter was sent to the Commissioner of the Department of Transportation concerning the Cranbury Circle. Cranbury Township received a response from the DOT requesting a formal presentation of the problems at the Circle. Mayor Cook stated other remedies, such as Old Trenton Road extending to Liberty Way, could also be addressed in the future.

--Mr. Johnson

Mr. Johnson reported he attended the School Board Meeting, which was the annual Budget Meeting, and stated there will be a .0147 cent decrease in school taxes. Mr. Johnson reported that several years ago the School Board discovered there were State grants available for capital projects. He stated the Finance Committee compiled a list of building projects, submitted applications to the State, and were able to get most of the projects done with 40% reimbursements from the State.

Mr. Johnson reported he attended a Planning Board Meeting, which heard an application from Alfieri concerning a warehouse to be constructed on the south side of Half Acre Road. He stated the warehouse would be a little over 750,000 square feet, and stated no tenant was mentioned.

Ms. Goetz reported Brainerd Lake will be treated next week. She stated letters were mailed and information was posted on the web site. She stated this is the first treatment to treat the weeds early.

Mr. Mulligan inquired if the Township acquired a road striping machine. He stated there had been some striping requests for Cranbury Greene. Ms. Marabello stated Public Works is now working on chipping and getting ready for Memorial Day.

Mr. Mulligan reported he saw an announcement that there has been enhanced speeding enforcement in Town. Mr. Mulligan stated he feels the enforcement needs to be consistent. He inquired if the Committee will receive a briefing or documentation. Mayor Cook stated the Chief will supply him with a report and/or come in to speak to the Committee periodically.

--Subcommittees

Mr. Kallan gave an update on the clock repairs. He reported the necessary documents have been received from Connecticut Time Keepers, along with an estimated six (6) week repair time. Mr. Kallan reported the company applied for a New Jersey Business Registration on May 3rd. Mr. Kallan stated he and Mr. Paul Mullen feel very confident with this company repairing the clock. The cost of repairs is \$10,600.

Follow-up Items

The Township Committee discussed purchasing a canopy for Cranbury Day and also purchasing some easels. It is too early to decide what materials will be displayed for Cranbury Day.

Ms. Cunningham reported there were no additions or changes to the Agenda.

Mayor Cook opened the meeting to public comment for items on the Agenda. Hearing no comments or questions, Mayor Cook closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

Ordinance Second Reading

A motion to enter an Ordinance entitled Cranbury Township Ordinance # 04-17-11, "BOND ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR VARIOUS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CRANBURY, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$994,600 THEREFORE, RE-APPROPRIATING \$482,000 PROCEEDS OF OBLIGATIONS NOT NEEDED FOR THEIR ORIGINAL PURPOSES IN VARIOUS CAPITAL ORDINANCES, FUNDING \$2,000 FROM THE PARKS TRUST AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$485,070 BONDS OR NOTES OF THE TOWNSHIP TO FINANCE PART OF THE COST THEREOF," was presented for second reading and final adoption. The Ordinance was published in the Trenton Times, posted on the Township's website, posted on the Township Bulletin Board and copies were available to the public. Ms. Marabello stated the items in the Ordinance were approved at the Budget Meeting. The Mayor opened the public hearing on the Ordinance. Mr. Richard Kallan, Wynnewood Drive, inquired why \$35,000 was being spent on the Fire House floor and why was it allowed to disintegrate to that point. He stated the floor should have been designed to handle the weight of the fire equipment, and the new floor should be better designed. Mayor Cook stated the floor needs repairs and he is not sure if it will cost \$35,000. No one further wished to speak, so the hearing was declared closed. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE TOWNSHIP COMMITTEE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF CRANBURY, IN THE COUNTY OF MIDDLESEX, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all members thereof affirmatively concurring) AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The several improvements described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is hereby authorized to be undertaken by the Township of Cranbury, in the County of Middlesex, New Jersey (the "Township") as a general improvement. For the several improvements or purposes described in Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$994,600, including the sum of \$25,530 as the down payment required by the Local Bond Law. The down payment is now available by virtue of provision for down payment or for capital improvement purposes in one or more previously adopted budgets.

Section 2. In order to finance the cost of the improvement or purpose not covered by application of the down payment, negotiable bonds are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$485,070 pursuant to the Local Bond Law. In anticipation of the issuance of the bonds, negotiable bond anticipation notes are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 3. (a) The several improvements hereby authorized and the several purposes for which the bonds are to be issued, the estimated cost of each improvement and the appropriation therefore, the estimated maximum amount of the bonds or notes to be issued for each improvement and the period of usefulness of each improvement are as follows:

Section 4. All bond anticipation notes issued hereunder shall mature at such times as may be determined by the chief financial officer; provided that no note shall mature later than one year from its date. The notes shall bear interest at such rate or rates and be in such form as may be determined by the chief financial officer. The chief financial officer shall determine all matters in connection with notes issued pursuant to this ordinance, and the chief financial officer's signature upon the notes shall be conclusive evidence as to all such determinations. All notes issued hereunder may be renewed from time to time subject to the provisions of the Local Bond Law. The chief financial officer is hereby authorized to sell part or all of the notes from time to time at public or private sale and to deliver them to the purchasers thereof upon receipt of payment of the purchase price plus accrued interest from their dates to the date of delivery thereof. The chief financial officer is directed to report in writing to the governing body at the meeting next succeeding the date when any sale or delivery of the notes pursuant to this ordinance is made. Such report must include the amount, the description, the interest rate and the maturity schedule of the notes sold, the price obtained and the name of the purchaser.

Section 5. The Township hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

Section 6. The following additional matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

- (a) The improvements or purposes described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are not a current expense. They are all improvements or purposes that the Township may lawfully undertake as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefitted thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of the improvement or purpose within the limitations of the Local Bond Law, according to the reasonable life thereof computed from the date of the bonds authorized by this ordinance, is 13 years.
- (c) The Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly prepared and filed in the office of the Clerk, and a complete executed duplicate thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government Services in the Department of Community Affairs of the State of New Jersey. Such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in the Local

Bond Law is increased by the authorization of the bonds and notes provided in this bond ordinance by \$485,070 and the obligations authorized herein will be within all debt limitations prescribed by that Law.

(d) An aggregate amount not exceeding \$25,000 for items of expense listed in and permitted under N.J.S.A. 40A:2-20 is included in the estimated cost indicated herein for the purpose or improvement.

Section 7. Any grant moneys received for the purpose described in Section 3 hereof shall be applied either to direct payment of the cost of the improvement or to payment of the obligations issued pursuant to this ordinance. The amount of obligations authorized but not issued hereunder shall be reduced to the extent that such funds are so used.

Section 8. The chief financial officer of the Township is hereby authorized to prepare and to update from time to time as necessary a financial disclosure document to be distributed in connection with the sale of obligations of the Township and to execute such disclosure document on behalf of the Township. The chief financial officer is further authorized to enter into the appropriate undertaking to provide secondary market disclosure on behalf of the Township pursuant to Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities and Exchange Commission (the "Rule") for the benefit of holders and beneficial owners of obligations of the Township and to amend such undertaking from time to time in connection with any change in law, or interpretation thereof, provided such undertaking is and continues to be, in the opinion of a nationally recognized bond counsel, consistent with the requirements of the Rule. In the event that the Township fails to comply with its undertaking, the Township shall not be liable for any monetary damages, and the remedy shall be limited to specific performance of the undertaking.

Section 9. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and the interest on the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. The obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable real property within the Township for the payment of the obligations and the interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 10. This bond ordinance shall take effect 20 days after the first publication thereof after final adoption, as provided by the Local Bond Law.

Ms. Marabello stated the cost to clean the clock is \$400. Ms. Cunningham stated Mr. John Kramer would take the clock apart, and clean the parts at his shop. He guarantees the work for ten (10) years. Ms. Marabello stated, for budget reasons, she would prefer to wait for the end of the year to have the work done.
