Mayor Cook announced the 2017 tax rate is 1.6 cents lower than last year.

Concerning the Route 130 Circle, Mayor Cook read a response from Mr. Matthew McDermott from the DOT, which states within the next six (6) months, the Bureau of Transportation Data and Safety will investigate the Route 130 Circle to evaluate the feasibility of making improvements. If it determined the improvements are feasible, the project will advance through the NJ DOT project development process. Mayor Cook stated the DOT will keep him updated as the investigation proceeds. He stated the DOT was very interested the Circle's crash history, which is significant. Mayor Cook reported the DOT will be filling cracks in the roadways with the hope of extending the life of the roadways in Cranbury.

There was discussion about the trees in the Township, and Ms. Larson, a member of the Shade Tree, stated most damaged/dead trees have been replaced. She stated the tree in front of Dr. Alexander's office is dead and must be taken down. Ms. Larson stated she will be updating the tree spreadsheet.

Mr. Richard Kallan, Wynnewood Drive and a member of the Clock Winding Committee, reported the Town Hall clock will be installed next Tuesday. He stated the clock tower must be cleaned before the clock can be put in place. There was discussion about a fabric shield to protect the clock from dirt and dust. Mr. Kallan stated he took photos of the clock being taken out, and will take photos of the installation.
