State Senator Linda Greenstein administered the Oath of Office to Mayor David Cook.

Mayor Cook gave the following comments: "Thank you members of Committee for your confidence and your decision to have me as you Mayor for 2012. I want to congratulate our newly-elected member, Susan Goetz, to Township Committee who will bring new ideas and new perspectives that I know we all we benefit from.

I am glad to say that my predecessor, Win Cody, has handed over the reins to a Township Committee that did a great job in 2011, which I expect will continue in 2012. I want to recognize our Township Administrator, Denise Marabello and Kathy Cunningham, our Township Clerk for an outstanding job that they and all of our Township professionals do, to keep our Town operating so well.

Cranbury is a town that has been thriving for over 300 years. In 1697 Cranbury was founded by a small group of individuals that had the drive to start a community. Continuing in this historical perspective for a moment, it was in 1714 that tea was first introduced into the American colonies. King George also became King of England that same year.

My point is that all of us here on the Cranbury Township Committee and the residents in this room are all part of very long and significant history that is American but also is Cranburian which continues today. It's our history and we all want it to continue for ourselves and our families.

It is with this spirit that the Township Committee serves the residents of Cranbury.

In 2012 Cranbury has a number of issues that we as a Township will need to address. Continuing hard times a result of a weak national economy will force us to focus on being even more fiscally responsible than we had to be last year. We face a shrinking revenue base as a result of property values, both residential and commercial moving lower. We face healthcare costs and pension costs that continue to escalate even with a small base of municipal workers. These issues aren't comfortable ones and all of us here at the dais including myself as mayor will have to address these issues head on as our budget process begins this month.

Cranbury also has projects to look forward to as well. We have a new Master Plan that allows new business and smart development to come to Town, creating tax ratables that in the future will help alleviate some of Cranbury's budget issues. I look forward to the new bridge project and dam that will address some of our water control problems that affect Cranbury. I look forward to working more closely with our School Board that continues to enhance a blue ribbon school system that creates such great opportunities for our children. We continue to set aside open space in Cranbury not only to keep our Town aesthetically beautiful but to keep Township costs down by controlling the level of certain types of development. There is much to look forward to.

I want to close by thanking all of our volunteers who serve on committees and other organizations that make our Town what it is today. And what our Town is today is GREAT!

Lastly, thank you to my children Jack and Olivia, and their mother, Angie, for their support through the last couple of years with Committee obligations. And, of course, thank you, Mom!

And thank you, Cranbury."

Statement Savings Accounts
Bonds or other obligations of counties, municipalities and school districts

Those authorized to make investments on behalf of the Township are the Director of Finance and Treasurer.

### Expenditures

The Township follows the purchasing system required by the New Jersey Fiscal Affairs Law.

#### **Current and Capital Funds**

Expenditures must first be authorized by a purchase order signed by the Administrator, Director of Finance, Treasurer, Chief Financial Officer or Purchasing Official. Upon certification on a voucher by the department head and vendor that goods or services have been received and the bill is in the correct amount, the bill may be listed for approval by the Township Committee at any meeting. Upon approval of the Township Committee a check with not less than two signatures will be issued for payment of a claim. Those authorized to sign checks are the Mayor, designated members of Township Committee, the Director of Finance, Administrator, Assistant Administrator and Treasurer.

#### Other Funds and Accounts

Payroll account checks which do not require a voucher need only one signature by the Director of Finance, Payroll Clerk or Payroll Supervisor.

All inter-fund transfer checks or bank transfers require one signature or one authorization by the Director of Finance or Treasurer.

# RESOLUTION SETTING INTEREST AND PENALTIES FOR DELINQUENT TAXES UNDER N.J.S.A. 54:4-67

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54:4-67 authorizes and permits a municipality to set penalties and rates of interest to be charged for non-payment of delinquent taxes and other municipal liens and charges; and

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 54:4-67 has been amended to allow for a 6% penalty on all amounts owed in excess of \$10,000.00 at the end of the year; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with N.J.S.A. 54:5-61 when the tax title certificate amount shall exceed the sum of two hundred dollars, the holder of the tax title shall be entitled to collect from the owner or other person having an interest in the lands an additional sum equal to two percent of the amount so paid for the tax title certificate. When the amount shall exceed the sum of \$5,000, such additional sum shall be equal to 4% of such amount paid; and when the tax title certificate exceeds \$10,000, such additional sum shall be equal to 6% of such amount paid. This section shall also apply to all existing certificates held by municipalities on the effective date of this act; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with N.J.S.A 54:4-66.3d, the third installment of current year taxes shall not be subject to interest until the later of August 1, the additional interest-free period authorized pursuant to R.S. 54:4-67, or the twenty-fifth calendar day after the date that the tax bill

or estimated tax bill for the third quarter installment was mailed or otherwise delivered. Any payment received after the later of August 1st, the additional interest-free period authorized pursuant to R.S. 54:4-67, or the twenty-fifth calendar day after the date that the tax bill or estimated tax bill for the third installment was mailed or otherwise delivered may be charged interest back to August 1. The tax bill shall contain a notice specifying the date on which the interest may begin to accrue;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Township Committee of the Township of Cranbury, County of Middlesex, State of N.J., that:

- 1. The Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to charge 8% per annum on the first \$1,500.00 of the delinquency and 18% per annum on any sum in excess of \$1,500.00
- 2. The Tax Collector is hereby authorized and directed to charge the 6% year end penalty on delinquent taxes greater than \$10,000.00
- 3. Effective January 1, 2012 there shall be a ten (10) calendar day grace period after the due date of each quarterly tax installment in which payments will be not be subject to interest charges.
- 4. Any tax payment not made in accordance with paragraph 3 of this resolution shall be charged interest from the due date.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the charges on account of delinquent properties as set forth herein remain in effect from year to year until such time as the Township Committee adopts a new resolution setting forth new or different rates.

WHEREAS, in accordance with N.J.S.A 54:5-54 the tax collector shall provide to any party entitled to redeem at certificate two calculations of the amount required for redemption within a calendar year at no cost.
