He also attended the Development Review Committee Meeting and stated a company needs to expand the parking lot of its warehouse. Mayor Johnson stated he also attended a Planning Board Meeting concerning an application on Station Road and explained there will be Home Depot on both sides of Station Road. He stated they wanted to align the driveways to enable them to "jockey" trucks, which would entail a smaller track moving trailers between the two sites.

Mr. Scott reported Lido Sushi has posted its new sign. Mr. Scott stated Gil and Bert's Ice Cream Shop is up for sale, and Mayor Johnson confirmed the owners are looking to retire. Mr. Scott stated he hopes a new owner will continue the business.

Mr. Taylor thanked Mr. Davidow for his work on the lease for historic barns.

Mr. Mulligan stated Mr. Tom Weidner, Parks Commission Chair, thanked the Committee for approving funds at the Budget Meeting.

Follow-up Items

Mayor Johnson stated the McMansion Ordinance will be addressed at a future Work Session.

Agenda Additions/Changes

Ms. Cunningham reported the date for the Community Development Block Grant should be 2018 and not 2017. Cranbury Township Ordinance # 02-18-04 is being removed in its entirely from the Agenda and will be considered at a later date. Two Resolutions, R # 02-18-053 and R # 02-18-055, have been removed from the Consent Agenda because the paperwork is not complete for the Professional Services Agreements.

Public Comment (For Items on the Agenda)

Mayor Johnson opened the meeting to public comment for items on the Agenda. Hearing no comments or questions, Mayor Johnson closed the public comment portion of the meeting.

Public Hearing Community Development Block Grant

Mayor Johnson officially opened the Public Hearing on the 2018 Community Development Block Grant of \$22,737.00. Ms. Cunningham announced, for the record, that this public hearing was advertised in the Trenton Times, posted in the Senior Room at Town Hall, posted at the Township's senior housing, posted on the Township's website, and posted on the Bulletin Board.

Mr. Berkowsky gave an updated on Cranbury Housing Associates and stated 30 of the new affordable housing units are now leased, with two units remaining. Hopefully by March 15th they will receive the Certificate of Occupancy. They are waiting for Freehold Soil to sign off on the Project.

Mr. Berkowsky stated last year, CHA asked for the funds to be used for engineering costs. Mr. Berkowsky requested this year's grant be used for the replacement of water heaters.

Mr. Scott asked how many children have moved into the units, and Mr. Berkowsky stated he did not know.

Mayor Johnson asked if there were any questions or comments from the public, and having none, closed the public portion of the hearing. He thanked Mr. Berkowsky for all of his time and hard work with affordable housing. Mayor Johnson requested a motion to adopt the Resolution.

a). <u>Discussion on Cranbury Township's Response to Legal Recreational Marijuana</u>

The Township Committee discussed with the Township Attorneys Cranbury's response to legalized use of recreational marijuana.

Mr. Taylor clarified the Township Committee is not taking a stand on the State's discussion of legalizing recreational marijuana. He explained this is a discussion on if the State legalizes marijuana, does the Township wish to legalize the

Discussion on Cranbury Township's Response to Legal Recreational Marijuana sale of recreational marijuana in Cranbury. He stated he and Kevin Lowery, Municipal Alliance Chair have discussed the issue. Mr. Taylor stated conversations included the impact of legalization to the Township, children and the school. He stated he also had conversations with the head of his company's office in Denver to obtain feedback on his experiences since legalizing marijuana there. Mr. Taylor stated he has concerns about people driving under the influence of marijuana and the possibility of increased dealings and sales of other drugs. Mr. Taylor reported on a Bill in the Assembly today which allows one recreational sale facility in the County. Mr. Daniel Davidow, Esg. reported there are two (2) Bills in the Assembly and he does not feel one facility per county will be how it will end up. He explained he feels it will be modeled more after the alcohol model where essentially it will be based on population and the municipality could issue licenses, but is not required to do so. He further explained, without a license, nobody could sell in the Township. This type of model could give a great deal of control to the governing body in each municipality. Mr. Davidow stated the issue has been discussed at length, and he has seen other municipalities in the State already take action to prohibit the sale of legalized marijuana. He pointed out there are many levels of the industry that will be regulated differently. There will probably be a manufacturing license, distribution license and the local issue of recreational sales. Mr. Davidow stated he has seen the issue focused on recreational sales, like storefronts and not a warehouse. He stated Cranbury would have to decide if they wanted some part of it or no part of it. At this point he stated we cannot say what the law will be at the State level as it is an unknown. He stated Cranbury is in a unique position compared to other municipalities in that the Township already has a medicinal facility in Town. He stated other states have toyed with or even have done the idea of grandfathering in some medical facilities to guarantee they have the right to sell recreational. He stated he is not sure New Jersey will follow that model; however, it is something to keep in mind.

Mr. Scott inquired if Mr. Taylor's information was based on Denver. Mr. Taylor explained Washington and Nevada have not had a long enough period of time so many of the studies are based on Colorado. He explained the University of Wisconsin did a property value study and stated there was a six (6) to eight (8) percent property value increase; however, some of that could be a result of taxation and new jobs coming into the environment so it cannot all be attributed to the legalization of marijuana. Mr. Taylor stated they did realize from the studies that most of the growth dispensaries are in urban areas. He stated many of the wealthier areas, like Cranbury, did not allow for recreational sales and those that did saw a slight decrease in property values. There was additional discussion about facilities and the impact on the communities. Mr. Davidow stated there is pushback from different people for different issues, including social justice component of legalizing marijuana and those who are opposed to marijuana in general. Mr. Davidow stated he would expect some decisions to be made by the end of June as the new Administration is banking a lot of money and their plans on the legalization of marijuana and the money the State collects from that. Mr. Scott stated the legalization would help the State but not necessarily Cranbury. Mr. Davidow stated there is an authorization for a local option tax, which would be a local incentive. The number he has seen is 1%, which means 1% of the total recreational marijuana sales would be kept by the municipality. Mr. Davidow stated he can advise the Township better once the law is actually written.

Mr. Scott stated his fear is the Township will spend a lot of time and energy coming up with something that will be irrelevant. He asked Mr. Davidow if the Monmouth County law is a waste. Mr. Davidow stated the Monmouth County Bill is ceremonial and does not dictate what any municipality should do. He stated the bill does express the opinion of the elected officials of the County. Mr. Davidow stated right now recreational marijuana on Cranbury's books is illegal.

Work Session

Discussion on Cranbury Township's Response to Legal Recreational Marijuana (cont'd.) Mr. Mulligan stated a medical marijuana facility has been here in Cranbury and there have been no problems with it. He stated he has no issues with medical marijuana: however, he has an issue with how the State will handle the legalization of marijuana. He referred to how the Township does not receive its energy tax receipts and stated had Cranbury received that \$300,000 each year, the Township would not have had to raise taxes the entire time he has been on Committee. He pointed out the debacle of how the State has handled affordable housing and the mess that has become, and stated he feels retail marijuana will be another train wreck. He stated his feeling strategically for Cranbury is to ban retail sales, which would give the Township a defensible position if the State enacts a law. Mr. Scott inquired if there has been additional information on the Bill based on population like liquor licenses. Mr. Davidow stated that Bill is still a prevailing thought as there is already a model in place to regulate or over-saturate the market. Mr. Mulligan recommended the Township put itself in a strategic position. Mr. Davidow stated Cranbury already has the medicinal facility, and if the State passes a law, Cranbury can address any incompatibilities at a later date. Mr. Davidow explained what other states are doing.

There was additional discussion among the Members about medicinal and recreational marijuana and how the Township should proceed moving forward.

Mayor Johnson stated he is glad the Committee is paying attention to the issue because he felt attention was not paid when medicinal marijuana was approved. He stated he does not feel recreational marijuana is not going to be a money maker for the State. The Assembly Oversight Reform and Federal Relations Committee will have a hearing and he has requested a time to speak about some of the points addressed this evening. Mr. Mulligan stated it is important the topic be discussed and the Committee agreed it was good it was on the Agenda. Mr. Scott stated there is a huge problem with OxyContin, and the damages from that far surpass the effects of marijuana.

Mayor Johnson opened the Work Session to public comment. Mr. Richard Kallan, Wynnewood Drive, stated an unfavorable element would be attracted to Cranbury and recommended an Ordinance be done against having shops that sell recreational marijuana in the Township. There was discussion about possession of marijuana and the penalties associated with medicinal and recreational marijuana.

Ms. Kathleen Argiriou, Stockton Drive, asked if the medicinal facility would be able to convert to a facility selling recreational marijuana. Mr. Mulligan stated we currently do not know what the State is going to do. Ms. Argiriou inquired if the State legalizes marijuana, would it be legal to use in public. Mr. Scott stated wherever marijuana is legalized, it is illegal to use in public. He stated he does not see permitted uses as is seen in Amsterdam and other parts of Europe. Mr. Mulligan stated the Township has already addressed smoking cigarettes in the Township's parks. Mr. Scott stated generally wherever cigarettes can be banned, marijuana could be banned also. Ms. Argiriou stated she believes it is good to be proactive.

Mr. Ernie Matthews, Old Cranbury Road, addressed the issue of people who deal with chronic pain. He recommended Cranbury not become part of the problem but part of the solution. He reported Cranbury's facility has the reputation of being one of the better facilities in the State for being a civil place to come and having a pleasant clientele.

Mr. Michael Kervan, Brainerd Drive, inquired if the Committee has reached out to Breakwater to see if they have any intentions of going in the direction of recreational

It has been agreed that they are benefit or at least a non-nuisance to the community and it would be interesting to see if are going to continue to sell medical marijuana or looking to pursue the sale of recreational marijuana. Mr. Davidow reported in Colorado medical and recreational facilities are not totally split. They have separate processes for regulation; however, in Colorado someone could walk into one building that sells both medical and recreational products. The facility is split inside and there are different taxes assessed for medical and recreational products

Hearing no additional comments, Mayor Johnson closed the public portion of the Work Session. There was discussion about how the Ordinance should be worded, including. no retail for recreational, continue to allow retail of medical marijuana and the wholesale of marijuana for recreational purposes to retailers outside of Town. Mr. Davidow stated an Ordinance would actually prohibit the sale of recreational marijuana. Mr. Goodell stated a Resolution would express the Committee's views on the subject and is could be sent to the Legislators. It is a consensus of the elected officials and the Township of Cranbury opposing the legalization of marijuana for the following uses. Mr. Goodell stated it is therefore on the record that Cranbury opposes it, and it sends a message to the lawmakers in Trenton about what they should do. Mr. Goodell further explained an Ordinance goes on the books as a law of the Township. Mr. Goodell stated the Township can legislate in an area where the State has not; once the State does legislate, it pre-empts the Township. He stated it is not known what the State will do. He explained an Ordinance would take the same type of process to roll it back as it would to enact it and has a continuing effect. Mr. Mulligan stated he would support doing an Ordinance to prohibit retail sales of recreational marijuana.

Ms. Marabello inquired where the Ordinance would go on the books, and Mr. Davidow stated it could go under Zoning, where an application would have to be made for considerations before the Planning Board, or under the Police, which then runs into the enforcement issues. Mr. Davidow stated something could be ready for the next meeting on February 26th.

JURISDICTIONAL AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is made as of the day of day of January, 2017 by and between the TOWNSHIP OF CRANBURY ("Cranbury"), a municipal corporation of the State of New Jersey having its principal office at 23-A North Main Street, Cranbury, New Jersey 08512 and the NEW JERSEY TURNPIKE AUTHORITY (the "Authority"), a body corporate and politic created by the State of New Jersey having its principal office at 1 Turnpike Plaza, Woodbridge, New Jersey 07095-5042. The Township and Authority are referred to from time to time as the "Parties" or individually as a "Party".

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, Corporate Drive, Brick Yard Road, Hightstown-Cranbury Station Road and Cranbury-Half Acre Road in Cranbury Township, Middlesex County, New Jersey, are roads owned and maintained by the Township; and

WHEREAS, the Authority has developed the New Jersey Turnpike (the "Turnpike") Interchange 6 to 9 Widening Program (the "Program") involving the construction of three truck/car lanes with full shoulders in each direction and the reconstruction of Corporate Drive, Brick Yard Road, Hightstown-Cranbury Station Road and Cranbury-Half Acre Road; and

WHEREAS, the Program will benefit the Township and the Authority; and

WHEREAS, the Parties are entering into this Agreement to set forth their respective rights and responsibilities with respect to the new improvements at the Turnpike and the road crossings of Brick Yard Road, Hightstown-Cranbury Station Road and Cranbury-Half Acre Road.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Parties hereby agree as follows:

- 1. The Parties agree and concur that they shall accept and exercise exclusive jurisdiction, maintenance and control over the respective areas marked on the Maintenance and Jurisdictional Maps entitled "New Jersey Turnpike Authority, New Jersey Turnpike, Section 4K, Brick Yard Road, Township of Cranbury, Maintenance and Jurisdictional Map, Exhibit A" dated December 2016, and "New Jersey Turnpike Authority, New Jersey Turnpike, Section 4K, Hightstown-Cranbury Station Road, Township of Cranbury, Maintenance and Jurisdictional Map, Exhibit B" dated December 2016, and "New Jersey Turnpike Authority, New Jersey Turnpike, Section 4L, Cranbury-Half Acre Road, Township of Cranbury, Maintenance and Jurisdictional Map, Exhibit C" dated December 2016 (collectively referred to as the "Jurisdictional Maps") attached hereto as Exhibits A through C and made a part hereof.
- 2. Except as otherwise indicated on the Jurisdictional Maps, the phrase "jurisdiction, maintenance and control" shall include responsibility for all roadway maintenance necessary for any roadway within the jurisdiction of the specific Party. Roadway maintenance includes, but is not limited to, maintenance and repair of the pavement, curbs, sidewalks, drainage, turf management, mowing, landscaping, fencing, berms, guide rail more than 12.5 feet from the

parapet/abutment structure, slopes of cut or fill associated with the roadway, pavement markings, delineators, signs, impact attenuators and/or crash cushions, litter patrol, policing, emergency services, and snow and ice removal.

- 3. Except as otherwise indicated on the Jurisdictional Maps, structural maintenance shall be the responsibility of the Authority. Structural maintenance includes, but is not limited to, maintenance and repair of the superstructure, substructure, underbridge slope abutments, abutment joints, approach slabs, wing walls, bridge parapet mounted fencing, guide rail attachments and guide rail up to 12.5 feet from the bridge parapet/abutment structure, sign structures, retaining walls, deck lighting, underbridge lighting, bridge inspection, and repair of structure damage due to normal wear and use, and accidental structure damage.
- 4. The Township. The Township agrees to accept and to exercise exclusive jurisdiction, maintenance and control over the areas marked by cross-hatched lines on the Jurisdictional Maps. In specification, but not limitation, of the foregoing, the Township's jurisdiction, maintenance and control shall include Brick Yard Road, Hightstown-Cranbury Station Road and Cranbury-Half Acre Road. Notwithstanding the foregoing, on the bridge structures the Township shall only be responsible for snow and ice removal, litter patrol, policing and emergency services.
- 5. The Authority. The Authority agrees to accept and exercise exclusive jurisdiction, maintenance and control over the areas shaded gray as depicted on the Jurisdictional Maps. In specification, but not limitation, of the foregoing, the Authority's jurisdiction, maintenance and control shall include the bridges along Brick Yard Road, Hightstown-Cranbury Station Road and Cranbury-Half Acre Road constructed over the Turnpike northbound and southbound, including underbridge lighting.
- 6. All utilities remaining within Authority right-of-way shall be maintained by their respective owners.
- 7. Right of Way Property Transfers. Within 90 days of the execution of this Agreement, the Authority shall convey and the Township shall accept all of the Authority's right, title and interest in the parcels listed on Exhibit D hereto, at no cost to the Township. Within 90 days of the execution of this Agreement, the Township shall convey and the Authority shall accept all of the Township's right, title and interest in parcels listed on Exhibit D hereto, at no cost to the Authority. These parcels shall be used for roadway purposes.
- 8. The Parties agree to perform their respective obligations hereunder in accordance with the statutes and laws of the State of New Jersey, all applicable regulations of the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection and the provisions of this Agreement.
- 9. The Parties recognize and agree to implement by such resolutions, deeds, grants and other documents and to take such administrative action as may be reasonably necessary to fulfill the purposes and intent of this Agreement within the time prescribed herein or, where no time is prescribed herein, within a reasonable time after execution of this Agreement by the Parties. Such instruments and documents shall not impose additional substantive obligations on a Party beyond those contemplated by this Agreement.

- 10. <u>Binding Nature</u>. Each Party hereto represents to the others that the execution of this Agreement and its performance hereunder have been duly authorized by all requisite action by it and that this Agreement sets forth its legal, valid and binding obligations.
- 11. <u>Notices</u>. Notices and communications under this Agreement shall be in writing and sent via certified mail, return receipt requested, and shall be directed as follows, or to such other address as the party receiving such notice shall have previously specified by notice to the party sending such notice:

Neither this Agreement nor any rights or duties hereunder may be assigned or delegated by either Party hereto without the written consent of the other Parties hereto, and any such purported assignment or delegation shall be null and void and of no force or effect.
- 14. <u>No Individual Liability</u>. No commissioner, director, officer, official, agent or employee of any of the Parties hereto shall be held personally liable under any provision of this Agreement or because of its execution or attempted execution or because of any breach or alleged breach thereof.
- 15. <u>Partial Invalidity</u>. If any provisions of this Agreement shall be such as to destroy its mutuality or to render it invalid or illegal, then, if it shall not appear to have been so material that without it this Agreement would not have been made by the Parties, it shall not be deemed to form a part hereof but the balance of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

- 16. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. The entire agreement between the Parties hereto is contained herein and no change or modification, termination or discharge of this Agreement shall be effective unless in writing and signed by the Party to be charged therewith.
- 17. Governing Law. This Agreement shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the Laws of the State of New Jersey, without reference to choice of law principles.

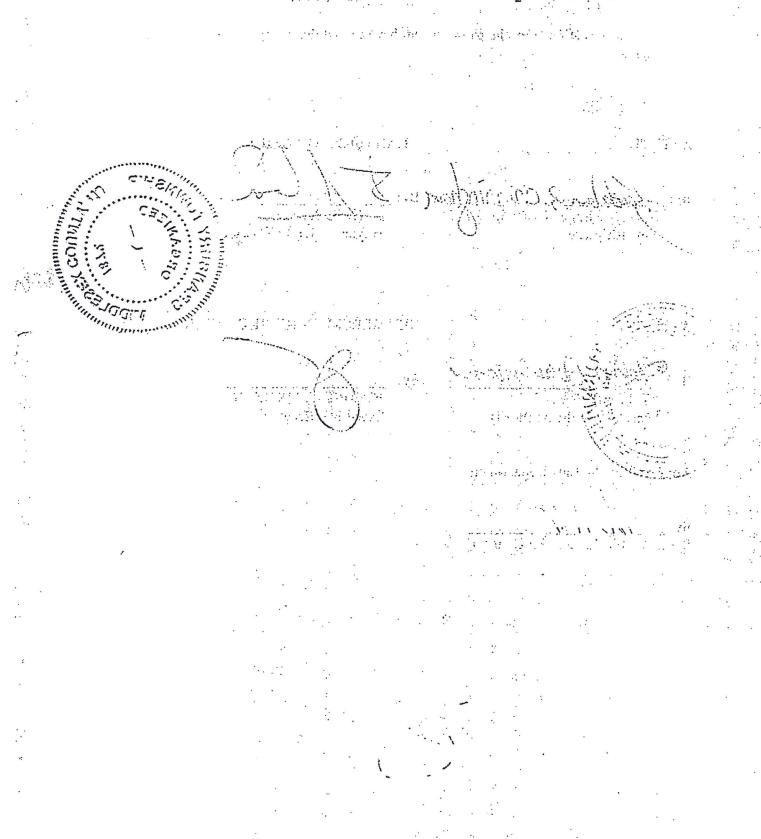

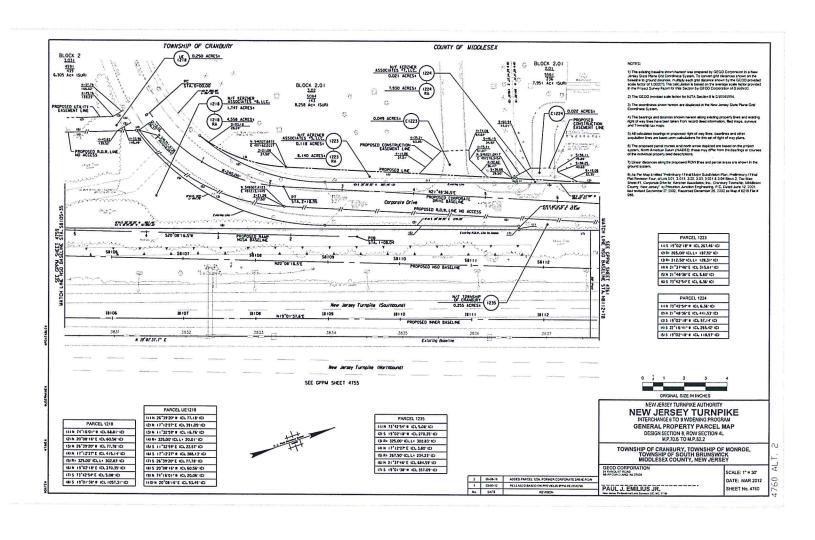
