Upon certification on a voucher by the department head and vendor that goods or services have been received and the bill is in the correct amount, the bill may be listed for approval by the Township Committee at any meeting. Upon approval of the Township Committee a check with not less than two signatures will be issued for payment of a claim. Those authorized to sign checks are the Mayor, designated members of Township Committee, the Chief Financial Officer, and Treasurer.

### Other Funds and Accounts

Payroll account checks which do not require a voucher need only one signature by the Payroll Clerk

All inter-fund transfer checks or bank transfers require one signature or one authorization by the Treasurer or Chief Financial Officer.
